# Chairman's Note

Welcome to the last edition of the Country Vibes for the year 2023. As we come close to the end of the year, I wish to reflect on several key highlights in the past few months.



**...a local Membership drive ending in June 2024 at a discounted rate of Kes 348,000 for full Membership and a Last call Membership drive at current Rates...**

The New Management Team comprising of the General Manager, the Customer Service Officer and the Chief Course Officer have settled in well. We have embarked on creating modern structures, policies, and processes that will provide better governance and operating framework for our club. In October, the Strategic Plan Review team consisting of the Board and Committee members met to review our Strategic Plan. Following the review, a revamped Strategic Plan for 2024 to 2030 document will be issued in due course.

We expect to execute the Strategy with focus to deliver on the Strategic pillars which are to:

1. Improve membership growth and satisfaction.
2. Promote and grow golf and gymkhana sports.
3. Improve existing and develop new club infrastructure.
4. Achieve club financial sustainability.
5. Enhance and develop the capacity of the organization.

We held a successful customer service week where we gave a courtesy visit to 3 of our elderly members. We intend to make these visits regular going by the reception we received from the members we visited. We also had a successful tree planting in November where we planted indigenous trees on the course and we intend to plant more trees in December, club Captain to provide further details as we move closer to the date.

As part of the initiative to increase club patronage, the Board has approved a local Membership drive ending in June 2024 at a discounted rate of Kes 348,000 for full Membership and a Last call Membership drive at current Rates before membership joining fees is increased. We propose to increase the joining fees once the proposed upgrade of the clubhouse facilities are complete.

In the new year 2024 we intend to roll out the proposed upgrade of the clubhouse facilities, starting with construction of a new gate with controlled access system. The gate house project is separate from the Club house project with its budget in place. We will then proceed to the clubhouse work which is pending completion of the final designs and approvals. We experienced some concerns at the land registry relating to numbering of our title which has delayed the search process. The proposed facilities will include a children's center, e-sports area, modernized/expanded washrooms for both ladies and gents, administration offices among others.



Over the past few months, our members have displayed incredible generosity by contributing various items to enrich and beautify our course. We've been fortunate to receive donations such as trees and flowers from Kiragu Kimani, Duranta flowers for hole no 5 by Ken Mambo, Chess Board by Dan Lubanga, bench for hole 4 by Sandra Grace, cabro for hole 5 by Director Kimungu Mbugua, Commercial Microwave by Director Andrew Koech among other valuable contributions. Your continuous support and generosity are immensely appreciated, and these contributions truly enhance our facilities and environment.

I intend to hold a member's Kamukunji aka Town hall in early January, which is an open forum for members to ask questions or seek clarifications on club matters. The Board will also provide an update on project status, costs and budgets.

As we enter the festive season, the Club will be hosting several events for Members, be on the lookout for the various updates on the club's communication channels. We hosted a lunch for life members who have not been patronizing the club for one reason or another on 12th December and we have planned a visit to Cheshire Children's home on 11th January. I appeal to you for donations especially dry foods or money to buy food for the Children. Any other donation like clothes beddings and toys are appreciated.

## *From the Captain's Tee* **Walking on the 18<sup>th</sup> Fairway**

### **Greetings members.**

This is my last update as Captain of our esteemed Club comes to an end later this month. Nevertheless, I am happy to update you on the initiatives of the 2023 Golf Management Committee (GMC) since our last update in August.

### **Golf Sponsorships**

In my last update, I requested for members' support in the second half of the year and I am happy to report that the support we have received in terms of tournament sponsorships has been overwhelming. In this regard, we have had all Club nights sponsored and at least three of four Saturday competitions sponsored between August and November. In the months of September and October, we had two charity competitions with an average entry of 180 players. We also had several course bookings on Thursdays, Fridays and Sundays which meant full optimization of our Golf course.

I wish to express my gratitude to the teams that make these sponsorships possible including the GMC, marketing and communications, the golf administration, food and beverage and Club management teams.

With regards to Golf course infrastructure, our starter huts were rebuilt courtesy of Laiser insurance brokers and County Pension Fund (CPF) with the handover combined with a sponsored Club night on 1st of November 2023.

## Golf course maintenance

In September, we recruited a Chief Course Superintendent Caren Mbogo to oversee the course maintenance function. The improvement in course conditions is testimony of her passion, diligence and hard work as well as the efforts of the course maintenance team.

In October, we conducted minor routine maintenance of our greens to improve aeration. A comprehensive maintenance plan is scheduled for December this year.

We unfortunately had several incidents of vandalism of irrigation infrastructure in September. Investigations were carried out and management has made a decision with regards to the persons involved in the incidents. In this regard, the Club has recruited a machine operator and mechanic as well as casual labourers to ensure that course maintenance continues uninterrupted.

At the time of our last update we had started replenishing sand in our bunkers and this is near completion. Golfers will also notice the duranta on tee number 5 course 1 with other tees including tee numbers 1 and 6 part of the wider plan to improve and beautify our tees. Once again I wish to thank the members who have donated these plants and flowers. In addition to this, we have started works on our muddy walk ways including the paths from tee number 5 to the green and from green number 5 to the 6th tee. We would like to thank our Vice Chairman Kimungu Mbugua for his donation of cement slabs.

We have started replacing the kikuyu grass on the aprons of our greens with the same bent grass we have on our greens starting with number 9. This is a long term solution to the invasion of kikuyu grass on our greens as well as improving drainage as sand will replace the loam soil at the base.

We have had several incidents of trees falling around our course over the last two months. Our course maintenance team has identified others as presenting potential risks. In this regard, we cut down one dead tree following the recommendation of a tree expert engaged by the Club with a few other dead trees marked for cutting. We have however taken the decision to engage an arborist from the Kenya Forest Research Institute (KEFRI) to conduct a comprehensive survey of trees on our course and give recommendations on how best to manage them. This will be done in the month of November/December.

In the meantime, we urge our members and course maintenance staff to exercise caution around the course and especially under trees and to inform the captain or the golf office should they identify trees posing risks.

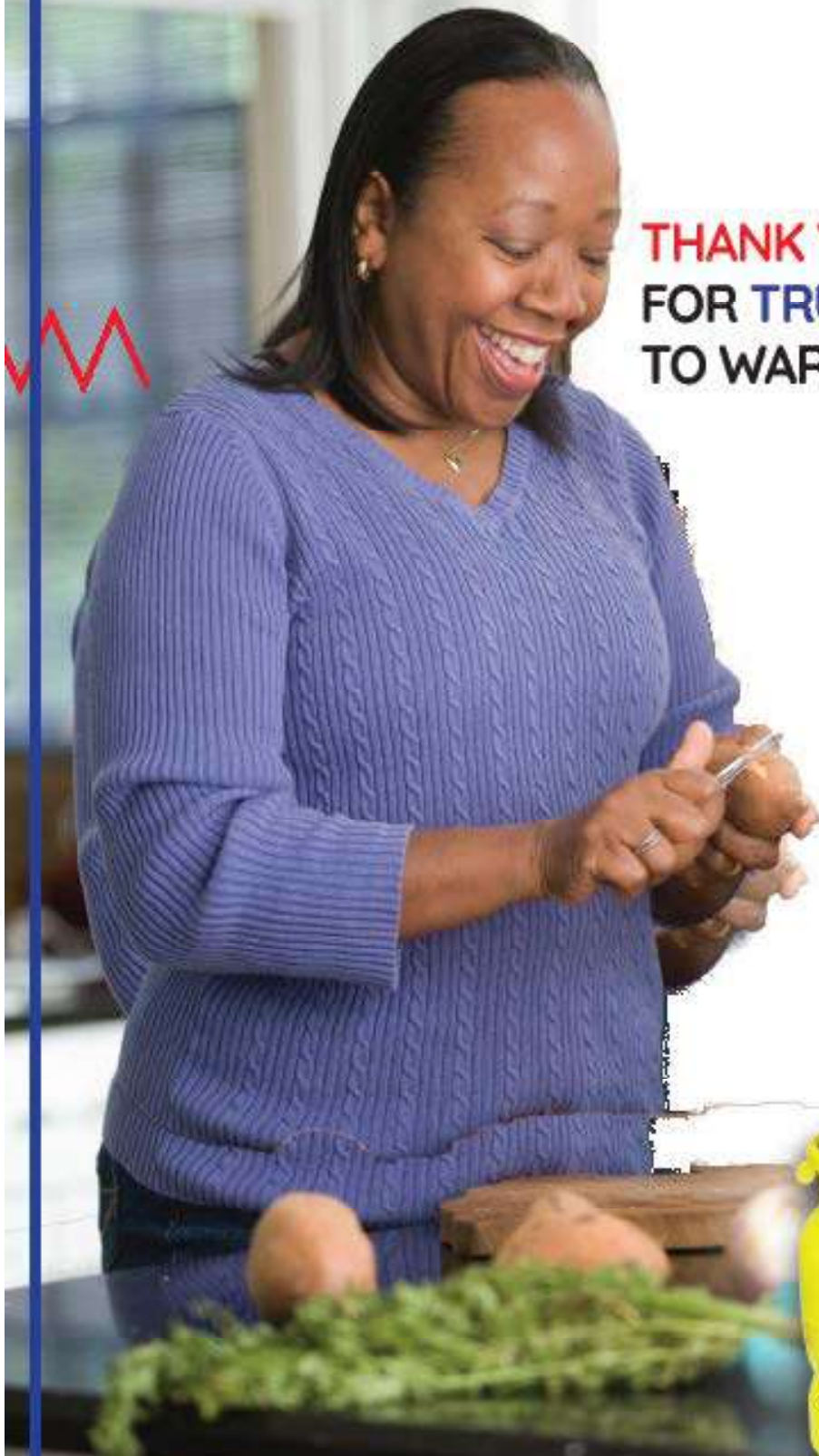

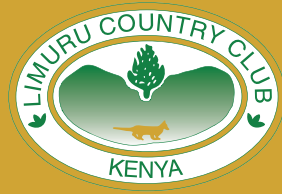
