A Year Of Progress And Renewal

Dear Members, Welcome to the May edition of Country Vibes, our monthly newsletter that keeps you connected to all the latest news, updates, and highlights from our monthly activities. In this issue, I am pleased to share reflections on the past year since my election as Chairman at the Annual General Meeting held on 28th June 2025. As I reflect on the past year, I am proud of the progress we have made together. Despite the challenges we faced, particularly following the loss of our Clubhouse, the Board, management, staff, and members have demonstrated remarkable resilience and commitment to the future of Limuru Country Club.

One of our key priorities has been strengthening governance and improving operational efficiency. During the year, we reconstructed member consumption balances to improve the accuracy of member records and reinstated the Jonas Club Management System to enhance service delivery. To safeguard Club data, we migrated our systems to Amazon Web Services (AWS) cloud hosting. The Club strengthened its management team through



key appointments and implemented several governance and operational initiatives, including a member clean-up exercise, a review of reciprocal club arrangements and entrance fees, a job evaluation exercise, and the renewal of the Club's land lease.

Significant investments were also made in infrastructure and facilities, including irrigation pumps, a tractor for course maintenance, staff offices and storage facilities, modern kitchen and bar equipment, and the heating of the swimming pool. In addition, construction of the Members' Pavilion commenced and progressed steadily, marking a major milestone in enhancing the Club's facilities and member experience. The Club made significant progress on its future Clubhouse project, successfully conducting a design competition and selecting a winning concept, while also engaging members through a survey to ensure the development reflects the Club's heritage and aspirations. Sporting and recreational activities remained central to Club life, with the hosting of major Gymkhana events and numerous sponsored golf tournaments.

Sponsorship support also enabled the renovation of the Cricket Pavilion. The Club continued to prioritize member communication through regular updates and newsletters, while maintaining its commitment to community support through various CSR initiatives. Staff contributions were recognized through an end-of-year appreciation event. These achievements, made possible through the support

of members, staff, sponsors, and stakeholders, have strengthened the foundation for the Club's future growth and sustainability.

As I take my final bow as the Club's Chairman, I look to the future with confidence and optimism. We have strengthened our financial position, expanded membership, advanced major infrastructure projects, and laid the groundwork for transformative developments in the coming years. Challenges will arise, but together we are well positioned to seize opportunities and continue building a Club that honours its proud heritage while embracing the future.

Together, we are writing the next chapter of Limuru Country Club's proud story—a chapter defined by excellence, unity, and vision. Limuru Country Club will remain a place of excellence, fellowship, recreation, and pride for generations to come.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony, scheduled for Saturday, 27th June, ahead of the Annual General Meeting, marks a significant milestone in our club's development journey. It reflects the Board's unwavering commitment to enhancing the member experience and investing in infrastructure that will serve both current and future generations.

This achievement also marks the successful delivery of the first major assignment entrusted to the Development Oversight Committee. Through dedication, close collaboration, and consistent oversight, the committee has helped ensure that the project was delivered on schedule and to the expected standard.

Today, we celebrate not just the opening of a new pavilion, but a shared commitment to progress, accountability, and excellence. It is a proud milestone that demonstrates what can be accomplished when the Board, the Development Oversight Committee, management, and members work together towards a common vision.

Donations

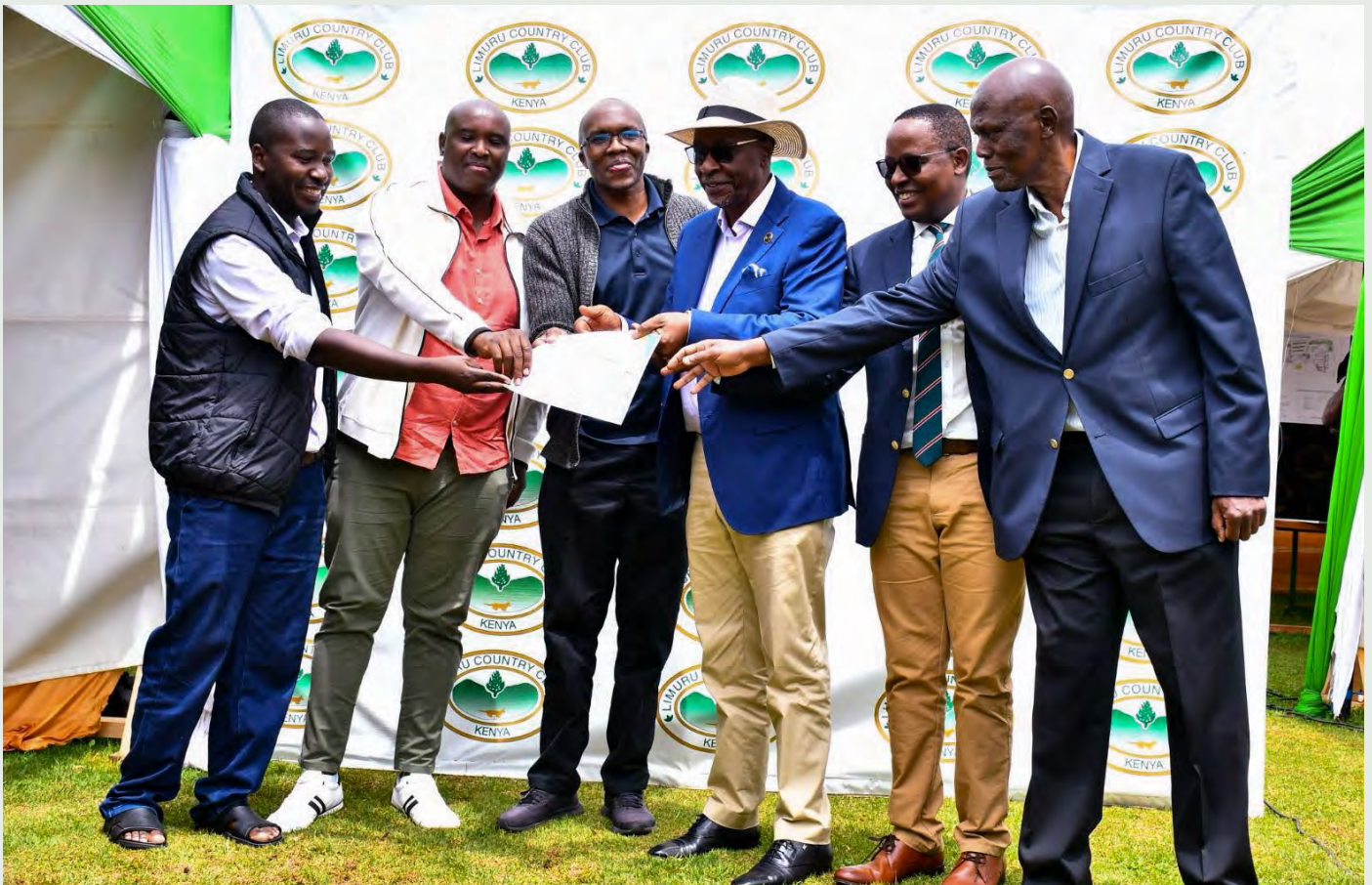

Architectural Design Competition – Winner Announced

Following the fire on 4 January 2025, a Limited Architectural Design Competition was held. From 24 expressions of interest, eight firms were shortlisted. The jury evaluated submissions between 4–6 March 2026 and announced the winner on 18 March 2026: TSOL – The Spirit of Limuru, led by M/s Decalogue International Ltd.

An independent seven-member panel ensured a transparent evaluation. To support fundraising, DOC hosted the Limuru Rising Invitational on 14 March 2026, attracting over 200 golfers and raising approximately KShs 800,000 for Pavilion works.

The New Clubhouse Design Survey

The winning design was presented on 14 March, and member feedback was collected via a survey that closed on 30 April. Responses are under review by the Board, DOC, and architects. Outcomes will be communicated after analysis.

Spatial Development Master Plan

A 25-year Spatial Development Master Plan (2026–2050) is underway. Six consortia submitted proposals under an RFP issued on 2 February 2026. Evaluation was completed on 27 March 2026, and the recommended consultant will be announced pending Board approval.

Stewardship in Review: A Food & Beverage Committee Perspective

It is now close to fifteen months since the fire that destroyed our iconic Clubhouse, including all kitchen facilities and equipment built over the years. We sincerely thank members for their continued support, including donations of essential equipment such as coffee machines, refrigerators, and freezers, which enabled operations to resume. The Club has also invested in key equipment despite limitations of the temporary kitchen and storage facilities.

To improve service delivery, we have installed additional POS terminals at key service points to enhance billing speed and efficiency. We are also expanding service areas, including a containerized kitchenette at the XYZ area and the cricket pavilion. We look forward to the completion of the Members' Pavilion in June 2026, which will improve seating capacity, ambience, kitchen space, storage, menu variety, service speed, and health and safety standards.

We are pleased to welcome our new F&B Manager, John Macharia, who brings strong experience in operations, cost control, inventory management, and customer service.



Member Feedback

We acknowledge feedback from the December 2025/January 2026 survey on food quality, variety, consistency, service standards, and ambience. A complaints book has been introduced at the bar to support prompt resolution and continuous improvement.

Beverage Price Review

Following rising supplier and operational costs, beverage prices were reviewed in December 2025 after consultation with the Finance Committee. This has improved bar performance with a year-to-date surplus of KES.2.7Million (Jan-May 2026), compared to a KES.50K deficit over the same period last year and above the KES.1.35Mn budget.

Additionally, we are working with various teams to turnaround the financial performance of catering with focus on procurement, stock control and pricing.

Staff & Training

We acknowledge Stephen Mugo (General Manager) and Alfred Murai for their contributions during transition.

We also appreciate the F&B Committee — Renaldo D'Souza, Kyle Denning, Stephen Ng'ang'a, Catherine Nyokabi, Wilson Nyoro, Roy Njuguna, and Mercy

Njoroge— for their oversight and guidance. Staff training continues, with thanks to Catherine Nyokabi and Wilson Nyoro for recent sessions covering service standards, communication, etiquette, grooming, and menu knowledge.

A job evaluation and appraisal process will also be implemented to strengthen accountability and motivation.

We continue to enforce the "No Plastics" policy and encourage members to use reusable bottles and mugs.
